2023 Rockingham County Community Health Assessment 2024 Mental Health



The Issue

The Rockingham County community has identified **mental health** as a top issue in the Rockingham County Community Health Assessment (CHA). Mental health is an important part of overall health and includes **emotional well-being**, **psychological well-being**, and **social well-being**. Mental health issues can lead to the misuse of substances like **drugs** and **alcohol**, and misuse of these substances can likewise lead to mental health issues.

Community Health Opinion Survey

340 Rockingham County residents participated in the CHA process by responding to the Community Health Opinion Survey. Among those respondents:

- **69%** said that they or someone they knew had been affected by **mental health issues** in recent years.
- Only 60% said that they were aware of the mental health services available in the area.
- **Preventing substance misuse** was picked as a top health behavior that people need more information about.





Substance Misuse

In 2017-2021 Rockingham County's **overdose death rate** was much higher than the average across North Carolina. Specifically in 2020-2021, the largest numbers of overdose deaths in Rockingham County were from **heroin** and/or **fentanyl**, followed by **cocaine**. Substance misuse impacts children in our community, as well. In 2021, **55 children** in Rockingham County were placed into **foster care** due to parental substance use. **Counseling** and **prescription medications** can help individuals successfully **overcome** substance use disorders. **Naloxone (Narcan)** can reverse opioid overdoses and is available for free at Rockingham County Public Health.
